## 2. Greetings

### 2-1 **Welcome Speech by Dr. Sung-Won Lee, President , ASF**

I welcome you all to Cape Town 46<sup>th</sup> FIS congress and 10<sup>th</sup> ASF congress in Southern Hemisphere. You all traveled to a Southern tip of the world. I appreciate very much for this assembly of ASF congress. Today, we have participation of 11 countries out of 15 member countries.

Past two years, we carried out successfully two Asian Alpine Ski Championships. In March 2007, Asian Alpine Ski Championships for children at Yongpyong, Korea. Eleven countries participated. In Feb 2008 same championships for junior at Faraya Mzaar ski resort of Lebanon. Seven countries participated. Detailed reports would be given later on.

One note-worthy point at the time of the 2006 championships for children at Yongpyong, Korea was participation and showing up of Kazakhstan team led by Nadezhda Bozhko, secretary general of Kazakhstan Alpine Ski Federation in spite of no contact for some years in past. With Kazakhstan we had not had good communications for few years before then, and it made a good starting point renewing our good communication and as well as with FIS. Now, we hear Kazakhstan is ready for 2011 the 7<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games in Almaty, Kazakhstan for which we also hear a brief report later.

For both Asian Alpine Ski Championships, ASF received FIS Aid and Promotion travel subsidy for participating countries from abroad (4 racers and 1 coach for each country), and amount of subsidy for organizing country is also increased.

ASF is very much appreciative of strong and continuing support of FIS, particularly to President Gian Franco Kasper for his special attention for the development of Asian ski and solidarity, friendship.

Lately, I am very happy to see that more and more Asian Ski Federation member countries, such as India, Iran ....., are applying for FIS Solidarity Fund and achieving their goals successfully to a reasonable extend under good understanding and support of President Gian-Franco Kasper of FIS.

Once again, I am very happy to have you all here at the 10<sup>th</sup> ASF congress and welcome you all to this congress. I'm sure we will have a successful and fruitful congress meeting this afternoon with good cooperation and solidarity of ASF.

## **2-2 Special Guest's Speech by Mr. Gian-Franco Kasper, President, FIS**

It is my big pleasure to be here and to welcome you from all the ASF members participating in the FIS congress. As you have seen, many people have come here in the African continent from far away. This means your interests in sports are very important worldwide.

The Asian Ski Federation has been a good sample how to promote and develop ski sports. The member countries led by Dr. Sung-Won LEE have done many great jobs in ski activities step by step, more and more competitions. I believe Dr. Lee, serving in the FIS Aid and Promotion Working Group of FIS, takes good care of Asian region with strong friendship and financial support.

As you all know, there are big elections during this FIS congress for the candidate cities of the FIS championships. They are all good candidates, therefore it is not important which candidate city will be chosen. The outcome is not so significant from the sport point and the FIS point of view.

Lastly, I thank Dr. Lee for having me here and gladly congratulate on his hard works as president of ASF. I wish you all successful decisions during the meeting. As we are all international ski families, I hope you would enjoy and relax during both ASF and FIS congress.

### **3. Acceptance of Official Minutes of the 9<sup>th</sup> ASF Congress in 2006**

The minutes of the 9<sup>th</sup> ASF congress in Vilamoura/Algarve, Portugal on May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2006 were unanimously accepted. The minutes had been circulated to member countries on July 28<sup>th</sup>, 2006 and there were no other comments.

### **4-1 Financial Report**

The financial report for 2006-2008 was unanimously accepted with the confirmation of one of ASF auditors, Mr. Ren-Guey Liang of Chinese Taipei, which is attached. There were no further views and remarks.

### **4-2 Report on the 16<sup>th</sup> Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Children) in Korea in March 2007**

During the 16<sup>th</sup> Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Children) held at Yongpyong ski resort in Korea on March 7<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup>, 2007, 7 gold medals out of 8 medals were awarded to Korea, and 1 gold medal to Japan. Especially, Lebanon got 1 bronze medal.

A notable feature was that Rashael Kanwal from India ranked the 7<sup>th</sup> in giant slalom, Children I ladies category at the championships. She joined the PyeongChang's 'Dream Program' in 2005 and 2006, which has been designed for young future athletes from least favored countries with winter sports such as African and Southeast Asian countries, etc.

The championships resulted in the participation with the 11 Asian Ski Federation member countries (TPE, HKG, IND, IRA, JPN, KAZ, KOR, LIB, MGL, PAK, UZB) under the FIS Aid and Promotion Program. A report to FIS by Dr. Sung-Won Lee is attached.

#### **4-3 Report on the 17<sup>th</sup> Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Junior) in Lebanon in February 2008**

Lebanon reported the 17<sup>th</sup> Asian Junior Alpine Ski Championships, held at Faraya-Mzaar ski resort in Lebanon on February 23<sup>rd</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup>, 2008, was very nice and successful. They thanked President Lee for his valuable support.

India mentioned about the visa process of Lebanon. President Lee proposed earlier application for getting a visa because the visa policy in each country is different.

The ASF championships were staged for the second time in Lebanon and resulted in the participation with the 7 Asian Ski Federation member countries (IND, IRA, KAZ, KOR, LIB, MGL, UZB) with 60 racers and 16 foreign coaches and officials. The FIS Aid and promotion Program supported airfare for 4 racers and 1 official per each nation. A report on the championships to FIS by Dr. Sung-Won Lee is attached.

## **5-1-2 Membership of ASF for Nepal**

Nepal was present at this congress as observer and they officially proposed their membership of ASF.

First of all, for a provisional membership of ASF, they should submit formal documentation; such as an official application letter with a brief report on their association's background and ski activities, and an official letter supported by the Nepal Olympic Committee. Then, the full membership of ASF will be officially ratified at next 11<sup>th</sup> ASF congress.

## **5-2 Agenda Proposals**

### **5-2-1 Hong Kong's Proposal**

President Lee remarked that Hong Kong's proposal for "Coach Development Program" was very appropriate one and ASF once organized a very successful alpine coaches seminar at the time of the 4<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games at Yongpyong, Korea in 1999 with FIS Aid and Promotion Program.

As a matter of fact, country like India is already conducting regional ski coaches (both alpine and cross-country) camps under FIS solidarity program at Gulmarg area and the fruitful results are well received even by FIS.

Concerning to such coaches seminar at any site, the biggest problem is the cost of assembling such coaches from all over Asia, that is, the traveling expenses of all coaches from their countries to the sites of the seminar. Arrangement of a qualified professional instructor from FIS is a least problem, which can be well supported by FIS.

After pertinent explanations, Dr. Lee concluded the issue with the following suggestion. At the time of Asian Alpine Ski Championships which is being carried on annually, we will try to amalgamate alpine coaches seminars with the championships. Since all the coaches, one from each participating countries abroad, are supported in their travel expense already by FIS Aid and Promotion Program, we are only to concern about additional one or at most two extra days of stay at the championships site, which would be additional burden for the organizing country.

President Lee will solve this problem appropriately, considering the fact that the subsidy amount for the organizing country for the championships has been increased to US\$10,000 from an average subsidy amount of approximately US\$4,000 since 2006 Asian Alpine Championships (Junior) at Nagano, Japan, simply because of high cost and prices of Japan.

Taking into all the related facts into consideration, it is concluded that we will come up with the most reasonable solution for the problem, and we would try to conduct alpine coaches seminar for one or two days at the time of ASF's Alpine Ski Championships right prior to the competition dates.

### **5-2-2 India's Proposal**

India's proposal for ASF to organize Asian Cross-Country Ski Championships annually and for India to start off the 1<sup>st</sup> Asian Cross-Country Ski Championships was well noted, recalling a similar proposal already made by Chinese Ski Association at the 9<sup>th</sup> ASF congress in Vilamoura/Algarve, Portugal in May 2006.

Bringing in concept of organizing another Asian Ski Championships in ASF, whether it is for Cross-Country Ski or even Alpine Ski Championships for senior, the biggest hurdle is again enormous travel expenses for participants over wide Asian continent. It is recalled that when India decided to have a regional cross-country ski championships inviting all Asian Ski Federation member countries in 2004, responses from Asian member countries were not good and the plan for the championships was cancelled for the year.

Lately, China is very active in cross-country ski on their own, even reaching the stage of conducting FIS Cross-Country World Cups competitions in the discipline of "Sprint" in the big city park of Changchun city of Jilin province, northeast of China. China has FIS homologated regular cross-country courses at Beidaho ski resort of Jilin province, where the 6<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games were held in February 2007.

Unless such a big issue of air-travel expenses over the Asian continent for long traveling participants, it is hardly plausible to have another full scaled Asian Ski Championships. However, we should consider regional competitions first in the form of any FIS competition where neighboring regional competitions easily can participate without such cost.

Another aspects in relation to regional activities of ASF is promotion of regional ski training camps and ski coaches seminar which can be easily formulated among close regional countries such as LIB, IRA, PAK, IND. Such activities are very welcomed by FIS Solidarity Fund, therefore ASF member countries are strongly suggested to formulate and utilize such opportunities upon regional consultations.

President Lee has praised highly such efforts of India and Iran last two years for various ski competitions camps and ski coaches camps for training and education in alpine, snowboard and cross-country under FIS solidarity programs. All the experts and professional instructors were supported by FIS under the solidarity fund. These efforts are good starts for utilization of FIS solidarity programs.

It is suggested that those member countries, who formulated same projects and benefited by FIS solidarity fund with a partial or a whole approval, should make brief reports on their success cases for other member countries to observe and to learn.

In connection with promotion of regional competitions or championships, there have been continuously raised a notion of regional cups, namely "Alpine West Asian Cup" or "South Asian Cup", etc. The "Alpine West Asian Cup" was once raised by Iran. The "South Asian Cup" was raised by India. However, the regional "Cup" idea has not been accepted easily by ASF as a whole, because it seems to imply division of ASF into several blocks under each "Cup", without any assurance of well-balanced successful activation and promotion within each block.

It has been felt that the total activity of ASF is not so grand that requires decision of activity into smaller regions such as "West", "East", "South", "Central", etc. Ski development activity of individual country has to be maximized by each National Ski Association and regional cooperations have to be exercised for FIS competitions through mutual participations and programs.

This issue of mutual cooperation to level up regional ski activities among neighboring countries will be continuously studied and discussed among the president group countries (CHN, JPN, IRA, KOR) to reach any reasonable medium to long-term solutions

### **5-3-3 Kazakhstan's Report**

Kazakhstan reported briefly on their preparation process for the 7<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games of 2011 at the Chimbulak ski resort in Almaty, Kazakhstan and outline contents of their Asian Winter Games.

Nadezhda Bozkho, secretary general of KAZ reported shortly as follows.

Chimbulak is a ski resort near Almaty, the largest city of Kazakhstan. It is located in the upper part of the Medeu Valley in the Zailiisky Alatau mountain range, at the elevation of 2,260 meters above the sea level. The resort is popular for its mild climate, large quantity of snow through the winter (from November till May). The weather varies from +20°C in summer to -7°C in winter and snow lay in winter is about 2 meters.

There is a modern sport complex built for ski lovers. The length of ski runs is 1,000 meters; they start from a saddle of Talgar pass, at the altitude of 3,200 meters, where skiers are brought by four high-speed chair lifts. Slope angle is about 100-300 grad.

4-levels hotel may accommodate up to 250 people. In the hotel you will find cafe, bowling, Finnish sauna, training center. There is a parking place near the hotel. In summer the hotel is also full, since the chair lifts work all the year round. For skiers and visitors there is a ski school, department stores, sport shops, children playground and terrace for sunbathing.

This year Chimbulak has homologated its courses and obtained certificates of homologation for the following courses; Slalom, Giant Slalom, Super G and Downhill. In March 2008, Alpine Ski Federation of Kazakhstan organized and realized the 1<sup>st</sup> FIS competition in Kazakhstan since last 20 years. As a result of this competition, we have got positive opinion of Technical Delegate.

As for today Chimbulak ski resort prepares hardly for carrying out of Alpine ski disciplines in frames of the 7<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games in 2011. With your support, KAZ are ready to host the 19<sup>th</sup> Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Junior) in 2010.

We believe you will love Chimbulak ski area and keep memories of beautiful and silent world of the mountains for a long time.

This is the second time to be staged the Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships at Yongpyong resort. All the children competitors enjoyed the slope with good snow, good weather and beautiful winter scenery. Before the weeks of championships, the weather was unusually warm. However, for the week of championships, fortunately the weather got cold and temperature ranged about -1°C ~ -3°C. Therefore, natural conditions were good enough for successful championships.

## **5. Comment**

The Lebanese Ski Federation staged the 17<sup>th</sup> Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Junior) in Lebanon for the second time. Despite of the political situation in Lebanon, 31 young skiers from 6 Asian foreign countries participated. The championships resulted in a total success with ardent efforts of Lebanese Ski Federation.

This event took place on Tourisme et Sports d'Hiver Mzaar ski slopes for the first time. The temperature on the slope during the championships ranged about 0°C ~ 3°C, which was mild. As the snow condition became rather soft and wet, unlike GS schedule, SL schedule was conducted tightly without break time between the 1<sup>st</sup> run and the 2<sup>nd</sup> run. Therefore, the championships carried out successfully.

Awards were given from the 1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> place of racers. Medals were given from the 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Certificates were given to the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> place. Overall nation's cups were given from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> place of nations. Furthermore, there were other awards, which were given to the team captains of participating each nation, to the technical delegate, Mr. Bojan Panovski, and to the president of Asian Ski Federation, Dr. Sung-Won Lee.

Under good cooperation of the Lebanese Ski Federation and the financial aids of the Minister of Youth and Sports, this championship was effectively well executed with enthusiastic local support. Entire foreign participants were pleased with an essential Mediterranean winter. They enjoyed friendship and solidarity among Asian ski families.
