2. Greetings

2-1 **Welcome Speech** **by Dr. Sung-Won Lee, President , ASF**

I sincerely welcome you all here in Antalya, Turkey for this 11th ASF congress. Fortunately, it is lucky that Turkey is easily accessible to both Asian countries and any other European countries comparing with past congress in Cape Town, South Africa in 2008.

The most important item to discuss for two-year term of ASF congress is, of course, Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Children & Junior). In case of children championships in Lebanon in 2009, there was a big change in their organization. New management headed by Mr. Toni Khoury, who is IOC member of Lebanon, undertook the previous management organization's commitment conducted the championships successfully.

In case of junior championships in Kazakhstan this year in 2010, there was the largest participation of member countries, 12 countries out of 16 members. Russia and Bosnia participated as a guest country. Therefore, 14 countries were participated and created a new atmosphere, which was very important and fruitful among member countries. It was notable that North Korea and Nepal participated at the Asian Alpine Ski Championships for the first time this year. Furthermore, another notable thing was that we had the Super-G competition for the first time at this championships in Kazakhstan, which had never been conducted at the Asian Alpine Ski Championships.

As you all know, there will be the 7th Asian Winter Games in Kazakhstan next year and we will talk more about the alpine program later at this congress. I hope we could come to an amicable conclusion on this matter.

One more subject to take up at this congress is “FIS Solidarity Project” as shown in a printed material and we will discuss more on this matter later at this congress as well.

Next 12th ASF congress coinciding with the 48th FIS congress will take place at Kangwon Land in Korea in 2012. Therefore, many good staff members of Kangwon Land hotel are here in Turkey for their observation and preparation. I hope that their efforts and experiences at this FIS congress in Turkey will be useful for their future successful result in holding the 2012 FIS congress at Kangwon Land in Gangwon province, Korea.

Once again, I am very happy to see you all.

2-2 Special Guest’s Speech by Mr. Gian-Franco Kasper, President, FIS

It is my big pleasure to be here in such a big big Asian group. I really can see the biggest development in skiing at this moment and it is no doubt this is surely because of you, ASF member countries. I remember very well many years ago we just had five or six members from Asian countries at the congress. However, it became a big majority, which proved to be a big development.

First of all, I thank you for your competitions and championships for last two years, and what you did in your area for young people like “Bring them to the show” in order to train them, which is very important for FIS as well. In addition, I appreciate for your reports concerning the developments of ski resorts and facilities in your country. This is, I think, why you have been growing so fast too much.

I also would like to thank you, of course, Dr. Lee, president of ASF who is also presenting as a council member of FIS. We have had some discussions particularly concerning Asia. He is my man and helped me a lot to solve any problems in your area. I know you have had excellent Asian competitions so please go on in this way. Your championships are also important to FIS. Therefore, FIS would like to support financially for those championships in your area in future as always.

Once again, I thank you for having me here and I wish you all the best decisions during the ASF congress and FIS congress especially regarding the elections for FIS council members. Good luck to you.

3. Acceptance of Official Minutes of the 10th ASF Congress

The minutes of the 10th ASF congress in Cape Town, South Africa on May 27th, 2008 were unanimously accepted. The minutes had been circulated to member countries on July 16th, 2008 and there were no other comments.

4-1 Financial Report

The financial report for 2008-2010 was unanimously accepted with the confirmation of one of ASF auditors, Mr. Ren-Guey Liang of Chinese Taipei, which is attached. There were no further views and remarks.

4-2 Report on the 18th Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Children) in Lebanon in 2009

During the 18th Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Children) held at Faraya Mzaar ski resort in Lebanon on February 14th – 15th, 2009, new management body of the Lebanese Ski Federation headed by Mr. Toni Khoury, who is IOC member of Lebanon, did undertake old commitment of the previous management organization. Mr. Edmond Keyrouz, new secretary general is here.

8 member countries (IND, IRA, KAZ, KOR, LIB, GML, PAK, JPN) participated under the FIS Aid and Promotion Program. Remarkable development in Iranian boy's ski was noticed and Lebanese girls got entire gold medals in GS and SL (Children I & II). North Korea intended to participate but failed due to lack of enough time for the communication and visa preparation. A report to FIS by Dr. Sung-Won Lee is attached.

4-3 Report on the 19th Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Junior) in Kazakhstan in 2010

The championships was held at Chimbulak ski resort in Almaty, Kazakhstan on March 4th – 6th, 2010 with the largest participation of 12 ASF member countries (IND, IRA, JPN, KAZ, KOR, LIB, MGL, NEP, PAK PRK, TPE, UZB) together with 2 guest countries from Russia and Bosnia.

Due to the special geographical location of Almaty with difficult accessibility of international flights, the total international flight subsidy cost by FIS Aid and Promotion program became quite high. It was notable that only one Japanese man got all 3 gold medals (SG, GS, SL) in Junior I. Kazakhstan ladies got entire gold medals (SG, GS, SL) in Junior II.

The elevation of Chimbulak ski resort is high, therefore it was a good chance for member countries to experience high elevation and get used to it for the 7th Asian Winter Games in 2011 in Almaty. It was, indeed, a good pretest event for next Asian Winter Games. A report on the championships to FIS by Dr. Sung-Won Lee is attached.

THE 7TH ASIAN WINTER GAMES IN BRIEF

Dates: January 30 – February 6, 2011

Place: Astana – Almaty, Kazakhstan

Sport programme: 5 sports, 11 disciplines, 69 events

Venues: 9 Competition Venues

Objectives: According to the Olympic and Asian Games spirit, the aim of these Games is to support solidarity, friendship and interchange between Asian countries and regions and to enhance creation of a harmonious Asia.

Motto: *Unity of purpose – unity of spirit!*

Logo: the design of the logo goes back to the image of a nomadic bullock cart. In heraldic art the wheel serves as a symbol of eternal movement, both in space and in time. Reflecting the idea of constant development, the logo becomes an emblem of life and represents creative dynamism. The symbolism of the wheel is close to that of the circle and according to ancient beliefs it expresses the idea of the God of the Sun going around the earth. Thus, the logo is a solar sign and represents the radiant power of a star that grants life and prosperity.

Accreditation

All applications forms for identification (ID) and accreditation cards (AC) will be available for on-line completion at the official web-site of the Games: www.astana-almaty2011.com, beginning June 1st, 2010. The deadline for completing or marking changes to the application forms is October 30th, 2010.

Following the completion, the identification cards must be signed and stamped with the NOC of the respective countries, which will ensure the right to enter and exit Kazakhstan with a valid passport from January 1st, 2011 to February 21st, 2011. The accreditation cards will be issued to delegates by accreditation centers once they arrive in Kazakhstan.

Athletes and officials of Alpine Skiing competition will stay at the 3 star “Premier International Alatau” Hotel in Almaty and the Shymbulak Ski Resort.

The awards to be presented to athletes who rank among the first six places are as follows:

First place: gold-filled silver medal and certificate

Second place: silver medal and certificate

Third place: bronze medal and certificate

Forth to sixth: certificate.

5-4 ASF President Dr. Lee's Report on Alpine Program of the 7th Asian Winter Games

Among ASF member countries, some serious discussions have been made regarding the inappropriateness of the current alpine program of the 7th Asian Winter Games which include only the speed alpine ski events (Downhill, Supper-G, Super-G Combined) since the program became known around in May 2009. In past, Asian Winter Games never had DH discipline in its alpine program and always had the technical events GS and SL as a basic alpine program.

Despite of the fact that response e-mails of 14 member countries (CHN, HKG, IND, IRA, JPN, KAZ, KGZ, MGL, NEP, PAK, TPE, UZB) were sent to Kazakhstan on March 22nd, 2010, requesting inclusion of GS and SL to the alpine program, they have not come to any conclusion as yet. Therefore, the congress came to an unanimous agreement to include GS and SL to the alpine program. 15 member countries present at the congress out of 16 total members (TJK absent) including even KAZ jointed the agreement.

A Japanese delegate, who is FIS TD, mentioned that speed events are dangerous considering DH ski level of ASF member countries. Moreover, most of ASF member countries do not have both DH courses and capable racers to compete in the speed events. Nepal and Iran also commented it was a big mistake of the organizing committee of Kazakhstan not to have GS and SL.

Three technical professionals (JPN, IRA, LIB) of ASF led by Mr. Mikio Katagiri, FIS TD in alpine ski went through a good study upon a mandate assigned by this ASF congress and have reached a conclusion that execution of DH race in the Kazakhstan Asian Winter Games of 2011 is very risky with the current alpine program. If any member does not participate the speed event of the program, she cannot participate in the alpine ski sport because there are no alpine programs in the program. The president Dr. Lee stressed that Asian Winter Games must be a happy winter sports festival being enjoyed by all the participating nations.

Finally, the congress gave the president a mandate to make an appeal directly to OCA to modify the current alpine program to a new program, SG, GS and SL, including basic alpine disciplines GS and SL and deleting DH which is most risky and least accepted by all members. ASF is continuously to discuss this issue with OCA and Kazakhstan sports related authorities to come to a happy conclusion acceptable to all the ASF member countries.

5-5 FIS Solidarity Project

A printed material concerning FIS solidarity was distributed at this congress for ASF member countries' information. Dr. Lee wanted member countries to formulate each country's plan on this base. During the 2008-2009 season, 18 countries proposed 25 projects. Among 18 countries, 4 member countries were from ASF (CHN, IND, IRA, KGZ).

In case of China, they requested hiring head coaches concerning the engagement of a trainer for training camps. In case of India, they requested training camp especially for regional countries, Nepal, Mongolia, Uzbekistan and India.

The president Dr. Lee stressed that from FIS point of view, a plan and result for the FIS solidarity fund should be realistic, reasonable, honest and developed step by step so that FIS can trust your project and activities. The information of FIS solidarity project made by FIS is attached.

- A1 Special effects on development of ski sport for youth and children
- A2 Consequences on development of membership of Ski Association
- A3 Effects on ski sport for all, general development of ski sport
- A4 Effects on top level ski sport in the country

- B1 Project as example for others Ski Associations
- B2 Effects on upgrading Ski Association in the country
- B3 Complimentary effects on tourism

(A = 1st Priority, B = 2nd Priority)

2. Examples of Activities and Projects

- Training camps with groups of young athletes either from the same nation or from a number of different nations under the guidance of an experience coach.
- Training coaches through the organisation of courses led by experienced coaches working in coaches' education and coaches specialised for young athletes.
- Training administrators and officials from National Ski Associations and their clubs through the organisation of seminars led by experienced administrators in different areas such as organisation of sports programmes; administration and finance; marketing, sponsorship and promotions; etc.
- Seminars on competition organisation and training of competition officials.
- Grants for competition equipment (skis, boots bindings, suits, etc), safety material (netting, padding, etc) training equipment (poles and drills, etc), equipment for race organisation (timing, start numbers, etc.).
- Construction or improvement of facilities for competition and/or training purposes.

5. Comments:

- (1) New management body of the Lebanese Ski Federation headed by Mr. Toni Khoury, who is IOC member of Lebanon, did undertake old commitment of the previous management organization. There was a complete change in management structure. The championships were conducted fairly well on technical aspect. Some ceremonial aspects were under expectation.
- (2) Good collaborations between the new body and the old body of the Federation organizations seemed to be desirable. Furthermore, good collaboration issue among all the ski-clubs of Lebanon seems to be a longstanding chronic problem of Lebanon to which the new president Toni Khoury did express his ardent desire and intent to solve the matter during his time.
- (3) Due to sudden instability of Gaza area and tighter visa problem, participation was lower than normal time. However, all the activities in Lebanon seemed fairly normal, except entry visa requirement was stricter than before. The resort area was well checked with army installation.
- (4) PRK (North Korea) intended first time to participate the Asian Alpine Championships this time. Communication was possible through Lebanese Ski Federation. However, due to lack of enough time for communication, PRK finally dropped their intent of participation. It is hopeful to realize PRK's participation in future.
- (5) Upon the invitation of Mr. Toni Khoury, president of Lebanese Ski Federation, Mr. Paul Michaelides, chairman, FIS Aid and Promotion kindly attended the championships. It was good opportunity to talk about the various issues of Lebanese ski in constructive ways.
- (6) Remarkable development in Iranian children's ski was noticed. The development effort of Iranian ski can be highly praised. Iran has good ski resorts (Dizin, Shemshaki, etc) and Iran Ski Federation is very well managed to my view.

5. Comments:

- (1) There was the largest participation of member countries of Asian Ski Federation, 12 countries out of 16 members (CHN, TJK, KGZ, HKG did not participate), and the championships was undertaken very successfully by the Alpine Ski Federation of Kazakhstan under strong support of the Ski Federation of the Republic of Kazakhstan and Kazakhstan sports authorities.
- (2) Due to the largest participation and special geographical location of Almaty, Kazakhstan with difficult accessibility of international flights, the total international flights subsidy cost amounted fairly high.
- (3) In particular, North Korea (PRK) participated at the Asian Alpine Ski Championships for the first time. North Korea participation was friendly and very much welcomed. Since Nepal (NEP) became a member of ASF at the ASF congress in Cape Town, South Africa in 2008, it was also the first time for Nepal to participate. Nepal was well advised to have good basic training programs in their neighbor country, India.
- (4) As Russia (RUS) and Bosnia (BIH) expressed their desire to participate, 6 people (3 athletes & 1 coach from Russia, 1 athlete & 1 official from Bosnia) participated as a guest country because they are not a member of ASF.
- (5) It was the first time to have SG competitions in the Asian Alpine Ski Championships ever, which was excellently staged.
- (6) Only one man athlete from Japan participated and it was notable that he got all 3 gold medals (SG, GS and SL) in Junior I.
- (7) The 19th Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Junior) was undertaken as a pretest event for the 2011 Astana-Almaty Asian Winter Games. It was well proved to be a timely good pretest event at the Chimbulak ski resort for the next year's Kazakhstan Asian Winter Games, especially for the alpine competitions of the Games.
- (8) In the 7th Asian Winter Games in Astana-Almaty, Kazakhstan next year, the alpine disciplines presently included in the alpine program are DH, SG and SG combine, excluding all technical events. However, most of ASF member countries wish to have the technical disciplines GS and SL in the alpine program. Fortunately, during the championships at Chimbulak, there was a good opportunity to discuss with Mr. Anatoly Kulnazarov, Chairman of Committee for Sports under Ministry of Tourism and Sports of Kazakhstan concerning the alpine program for the Asian Winter Games. Therefore, there will be some possible changes in their current alpine program for the 2011 Asian Winter Games.
