#### 4. Chairmans' greeting :

I am very happy to have the 3rd ASF Council Meeting here at Taipei today, which was decided at the 3rd ASF Congress held at the Rio de Janeiro, Brazil in June 1994. Since the decision of last year, meeting date has been readjusted due to some participant's special circumstances and the FIS Alpine(Calendar) Conference in past May . I would like to express my deep appreciation to Mr. HA. Kong-Sang, President, Chinese Taipei Ski Association, who proposed hosting of this council meeting at Taipei, for your warm welcome and all your hard works for the wonderful preparations.

As you may know well, ASF successfully staged the 5th Asian Children and Junior Championships at Alps Ski Resort in Korea at the end of February 1995, with a largest member participation from ASF, even including India, a new member country. It was, indeed, significant step forward for the progress of ASF to have such a new participations of Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan and India to ASF Championships event and to have the Junior Championships being upgrade to a FIS race.

It is, however, regrettable that Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan and Mongolia have failed to participate to this council meeting this time, despite of mutual efforts with sufficient lead time. We must exert more efforts of ours to promote friendship, solidarity and level of ski development among the ski families of Asia, and thus to achive continue successful development of Asia Ski Federation.

### 1) Summary results on the 5th Asian Junior Championships

\* Comments:

- A point to note is that there was no participations of Chinese competitor and Japanese cross-country team to the games last time. I would like to stress that we shall try out best to participate in full range of events in future games. (Chairman)

-China decided to hold the cross-country participation upon having heard cross-country races being cancelled due to snow conditions at the competition site.(China)

-In future, we shall also seek better communications regarding any final adjustment in competition schedule.(Chairman)



2) A Report on Continental Cup Sub-Committee Meeting, FIS Spring Calendar Conference at Obersdorf, Germany.

(By Dr. LEE, Sung-Won, Chairman, FIS Far-East Cup Sub-Committee)

- We have 5 regional continental-cup(COC) sub-committees:

Europa-Cup, North American-Cup, Far East-Cup in the Northern hemisphere and South American-Cup, Australia-New Zealand-Cup in the Southern hemisphere. A new edition of COC rule book is just mailed out by FIS as the result of the Alpine sub-committee meeting. Each copy is distributed for your information and study. You would notice that ASF member countries are very much favored in participating quotas and participating qualifications.

- The Far-East Cup(FEC) sub-committee consists of 7 members (Japan 4, Korea 2, China 1). Mr. PAN, Wei-Min of China attended the FIS continental-cup sub-committee meeting first time as a FEC sub-committee member and was properly introduced at meeting by me. He gave a brief informations to the meeting regarding to the '96 Asian Winter Games at Harbin.

- For '95-'96 FEC events, an addition of Men SL and GS at Muju Resort, Korea. We also hope to have Women's event in near future.

3) Brief Statue Report on The Progress of Preparations for The '96 Asian Winter Games at Harbin.(By Mr. PAN, Wei-Min, China)

-Alpine pistes are under reconstruction.

-Lodging accommodations are under smooth construction, about 500 beds at Yabuli.

-Highway construction between Harbin-Yabuli, to be completed by the end of 1995.(3 hours by car)

-Helicopter transportations to be planned for some special trips.

-Medical center at lodging facility area.

-Freestyle ski and Jump ski are programmed as demonstration event.

-Plan to invite ASF Council members to the Games.

-The handbook of each event(4 events) was distributed.



\* Comments:

- Why we don't have SL discipline in Alpine Ski event while we only have GS and SG. (Chinese Taipei)
- Should have SL before SG.(India)

**Council :Council recommendeds to including SL discipline before SG. Safty for the SG race have to be sufficiently studied before final decision.**

- Some concern over existing Jump Hill facility unless it is sufficiently remedied in overall set-up.(Japan)
- The council's view is well taken and will be discussed with the organizing committee. To be reported later.(China)
- Happy to see that ASF comes up with such constructive views and proposals.(Chairman)

6. Discussions & Resolutions :

1)Increass of Annual Fee:

- Questioned : Reason and necessity. (Japan)
- Current fee is simply too small. Barely to meet postages and communication expenses. We can consider a minimal financial assistance to ASF members when we have ASF ski events if unavoidable necessary.(Chairman)
- Propose to market for "Logo of ASF" and find sponsorship if we are to seek an income. Chinese Taipei can initiate such an effort. Desirable to establish a financial committee in ASF to cover such function.(Chinese Taipei)

- \* Chinese Taipei intiate such an effort and observe the result first, then come to a follow up action. Mr. HA. Kong-Sang and Chairman will coordinate on this matter and hope to come up with fruitful results as early possible.(Chairman)

*(Unanimously agreed)*



- How about charging an application fee to the candidates for hosting ASF Championship games.(India)
- To early as yet, perhaps in future.(Chairman)
- How about setting a range for the fee amount, namely \$200-\$1,000, and each member's voluntary decision payment.(Chairman)
- Fee payment is different from voluntary contribution. Better to fix an amount. (India)

\*Propose to take up the matter at the next ASF Congress, however, meantime the fee to be raised to US\$200.(Chairman)

*(Unanimously agreed and Resolved)*

2) Application of India to ASF member:

***Unanimously agreed and Resolved the acceptance of India's application.  
(New fee to be applied)***

3) Request for financial assistance from Mongolia Ski Association :

\*The official letter of request for financial assistance from Mongolia Ski Association was presented to the meeting(as attached) and acknowledge. The requested amount \$250,000 too huge to discuss at this meeting. Assistance for ski training can be dealt independently with respective concerned country. Each member country shall do his best in extending Mongolia ski team any assistance in training programs being requested and discussed. The matter will be discussed in future at the next congress after deliberation of each member in between time.(Chairman)

*(Unanimously agreed and Resolved)*

- Will support Mongolia Ski Team in participating any ski events in Iran and arrange ski training program in Iran, also hope to stage a Far-East Cup race in Iran in future. (Iran)

4) The site for the 6th Asian Junior Championship in 1996:

\*Japan to host the championships in 1996. Studying 2 sites and to finalize before June 21,1995 and apply to FIS calendar schedule for a FIS race.(Japan)



Alpine will be FIS race while cross-country will be demonstration event.  
(Chairman)

*(Unanimously agreed and Resolved)*

- Discussions on any championships site should be decided 2 years in advance. Now, apply for the 1997 championships to be staged in India. India has 3 sites and like to stage at one site in Kashmir. (India)
- The idea welcomes and encouraging. Tentatively we agree with conditions that we further study the detailed information to be presented at the next congress and no back-down after final decision. ASF ready to help FIS homologation of the in time and any supportive writing from ASF to Indian authority.(Chairman)

5) The 4th ASF Congress :

- The 4th ASF Congress to be held at the same time with the FIS Congress in New Zealand.(Chairman)
- Iran wishes to have the next ASF Congress in Iran.(Iran)
- Iran's proposal is very welcomed. However, at the time of FIS Congress we can be sure of complete attendance of entire members. Better to have our congress timing with FIS Congress so that ASF delegates can attend both congresses. Perhaps, we can have next council meeting in Iran.(Chairman)

\*The 4th ASF Congress to be held on May 4(Saturday),1996 at Christchurch, New Zealand.(The 40th FIS Congress May 5-12, 1996)

*(Unanimously agreed and Resolved)*

6)Other items :

- Replacement of Director of Iran  
from Mr. HEIDARI, Shokrollam  
to Mr. S. Shemshaki-Issa, President, Iranian Ski Association.
- Welcoming Mr. S. Shemshaki-Issa with sincere expectation to his big contribution and cooperations to ASF.(Chairman)



-Big expectations to Chinese Taipei's proposal for marketing of ASF "Logo" to formulate and create new business activities. Particular anticipation to Mr. HA's future activities and fruitful results.

(Chairman)

-May discuss in future to establish a financial committee in ASF to develop more aggressively any profit-making business for financial soundness of ASF.(Chinese Taipei)
