## **2. Greetings by Chairman** (Dr. Sung-Won LEE, President, ASF)

Once again, FIS Congress is down in the southern hemisphere. All of us from the northern hemisphere travelled a long distance together to here at Melbourne, Australia for the 42<sup>nd</sup> FIS Congress and the 6<sup>th</sup> Asian Ski Federation Congress. I welcome you all and thank you for your participation today. On behalf of Asian Ski Federation, I express our appreciation to the FIS president Gian-Franco Kasper who came out to decide to give one voting delegate from each National Ski Federation a full financial support for his travel to Melbourne.

Since the 5<sup>th</sup> Asian Ski Federation Congress of Prague in '98, the ASF has spent the busiest and the most meaningful period in many respects. The FIS Aid and Promotion Programs started to come into effective execution stage from February 1999 and achieved very fruitful results up into March 2000. The first program started with the Alpine Coaches Seminar on Pole Setting (Yongpyong, Korea) during the period of the successful gala event, the 4<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games, Kangwon-Yongpyong, Korea (January-February, 1999). Then, the 9<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships (February 1999 at Dizin, Iran), the Kazakhstan Cross-Country Coaches Seminar (April 1999 at Almaty, Kazakhstan), and the recent the 10<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships (March 2000 at Faqra, Faraya-Mzzar, Lebanon). The results were very fruitful and successful. Comprehensive reports will be presented at this Congress.

It was very meaningful to stage the longstanding Asian Children Ski Championships more diversified way out to the Far-West region of the Asian continent. The last two championships in Iran in 1999 and in Lebanon in 2000 were very successful and I was very appreciative of their hard and good works to achieve being a wonderful host. I hope to see this traditional Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships will be staged more widely across the Asian continent for more effective exchange of culture and friendship and for greater mutual exposure among different countries to enhance better mutual understanding, thus structuring more solid foundations for better future development of Asian Ski Federation.

Once again, I thank you for your complete attendance despite of long distance travelling involved. I hope you all will have a very productive and enjoyable stay during the Congress period here in Melbourne.

**Special Guest Speech:** (Mr. Gian-Franco Kasper, FIS president)

I am happy to attend at the 6<sup>th</sup> ASF Congress Meeting on today and to greet all of you as a member of ASF Country. ASF has been conducted his important role in the stage of International Skiing Development.

Following the decision of last 41<sup>st</sup> FIS Congress, FIS and Dr. Sung-Won LEE, one of the Working Group Members have established "FIS Aid and Promotion Program" which is to have beneficial effects for ski development of Asian region.

We will endeavor to promote skiing and increase the number of skiers to worldwide and to intensify cooperation between FIS and ASF.

Once again, I would like to express my appreciation to your kind cooperation and ASF effort for global skiing development.

**3. Reporting Items**

**3-1. Acceptance of the Official Minutes of 5<sup>th</sup> ASF Council Meeting**

There was no any objection for the minutes of 5<sup>th</sup> ASF Council Meeting which was held at Yongpyong, Korea on February 1<sup>st</sup>, 1999. Unanimously accepted.

**3-2. Financial Report**

President thanked to the ASF Secretariat for the preparation of the financial report which was confirmed by the Auditor Mr. Chin-Yin CHEN of Chinese Taipei. Unanimously accepted.

**3-3. Report on the 4<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games in Korea**

(Report by Chairman)

I am very pleased to report the 4<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games in Korea. This Games were held at Yongpyong-Kangwon, Korea under the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) from January 30<sup>th</sup> to February 6<sup>th</sup>, 2000. The Congress unanimously accepted the attached report by president.

### **3-4. Report on the Alpine Coaches Seminar on Pole Setting in Korea**

(Report by Korea)

A written report by Korea is filed as attached (Appendix 1). The report is summarized and explained by Korea. Highlight pictures of Yongpyong seminar were passed around and shown. The report was unanimously accepted.

### **3-5. Report on the 9<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships in I. R. Iran** (Report by I. R. Iran)

The 9<sup>th</sup> Asian Children's Championships to be held at Dizin, North of Tehran, Iran from February 18 to 19 1999. It was a good opportunity to reconfirm overall activities of ASF cooperation and friendship. We tried that the competitions were held in the best quality and standard statues. The largest number of ASF member countries ever participated the championships, owing to the FIS Aid and promotion program. All the foreign participants truly felt significance of the immense assistance and the appropriate support of FIS for their endeavor to level up their skiing. They were most appreciative of the program of FIS and all welcomed such a fresh new FIS policy for the ski developing nations. A written report was filed (Appendix 2). Highlight pictures of the Championships were passed around and shown. The report was unanimously accepted.

### **3-6. Report on the Cross-Country Coach Seminar in Kazakhstan**

(Report by President in place of Kazakhstan)

The '99 Cross-Country coach seminar was held at Almaty, Kazakhstan from April 22 to 23 under the auspices of ASF and Ski Federation of the Republic of Kazakhstan. 30 coaches (CHN, CTA, IRA, KOR, MGL, KAZ) were participated with the Cross-Country coach seminar. Personally I express my regret to PAK, LIB about VISA problem. All participants showed a great interest in all seminar report. Very interesting report had speaker, Ph.D. Professor Ivanov V.A. Head coach of the national Team of Russian. All reports were translated English by 4 interpreters and 7 assistants. Kazakhstan Ski Federation especially expresses to Dr. Sung-Won LEE the cordial thanks for sincere help, understanding, financial support. Written report was filed (Appendix 3). Highlight pictures were passed around and shown. The report was unanimously accepted.

### **3-7. Report on the 10<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships in Lebanon** (Report by Lebanon)

A complete written report together with the race results was filed (Appendix 4). Highlight pictures were passed around and shown. The report was unanimously accepted.

## 4. Discussions

### 4-1. Amendment of the ASF Constitution for Membership and Withdrawal

The proposed amendment was unanimously approved with the following small change.

Change:     3.3.1     Affiliate members may be invited to attend the ASF Congress as observer, but do not have the right of ASF.

To:           3.3.1     Affiliate members may be invited to attend the ASF Congress as observer, but do not have the voting right.

### 4-2. Ratification of an Auditor

Appointment of an Auditor was again assigned to President, as had been decided by the 5<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting, and is to come to ratification on the next congress. Unanimously approved.

### 4-3. Site for the 11<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championship in 2001

Korea proposed to host the 11<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championship at Yongpyong, Korea in March 2001, and the congress unanimously approved the proposal with the following schedule.

Organizer: Korea Ski Association  
Date:        March 2 – 3, 2001  
Venue:       Yongpyong Resort, Korea  
Event:       Children I & II, Boys and Girls  
              Giant Slalom, Slalom

\*Note: A budget through the FIS Aid and Promotion Program for subsidy of air-travel expenses for 3 participants (2 racers, 1 coach) from those beneficiary countries is already secured for the event Championship by ASF.

### 4-4. Site for the 12<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championship in 2002

Japan proposed to host the 12<sup>th</sup> Asian Children Alpine Ski Championship in 2002 in Japan and the details will be notified later upon consultation with Ski Association of Japan. Unanimously approved.

## **5. Election**

### **5-1. Election of Officials**

#### **President**

Based on the motion of Lebanon, Dr. Sung-Won LEE was elected as new president of ASF for 2000-2002 by unanimous approval.

#### **Vice President**

The intent of resignation of Mr. HA, Kong-Sang (president of Chinese Taipei Ski Association) was conveyed to the president through the delegate of Chinese Taipei, LEE Yu-Dek. Based on the recommendation and motion of the president, Mr. Farshid Alizadeh, vice president of I. R. Iran Ski Federation, was elected as new vice president of ASF for 2000-2002 by unanimous approval.

#### **Chairman of Finance Committee**

President stressed the importance of the job and the role, particularly in view of the fact that nothing had been performed by the predecessor Mr. HA, Kong-Sang over past years. The president recommended Mr. Farshid Alizadeh, newly elected vice president to assume the Chairman of Finance Committee to ensure better performance with added title and weight of vice presidency of ASF. Mr. Farshid Alizadeh was elected as the chairman of Finance Committee by unanimous approval. Mr. Atsumi Seo, as a member of Finance Committee, was re-affirmed. President stressed again activation of Finance Committee activities with tangible and beneficial results and great anticipation toward successful performance of the committee under the new leadership.

#### **Director**

- Chinese Ski Association recommended Mr. SUN Baiqing, replacing Mr. PAN, Wei-Min.
- Korea Ski Association recommended Mr. JUNG, Mong-yong, replacing Mr. CHANG Soo-Wong.
- Lebanese Ski Association recommended Mr. Elias HANNA, replacing Mr. Nassim KHALIL.

- The above proposals were unanimously approved.

#### **Secretary General**

Newly appointed Secretary general, Mr. CHUNG, Gyu-Whan (KOR), who had been appointed to the post by the president in September 1999 in succession to Mr. MOON, Dong-Wook, former Secretary General, was introduced to the Congress. He made a greeting to floor, expressing to do his best in his duty. Currently, Mr. CHUNG, Gyu-Whan is the Auditor of the Korea Ski Association.

## **5-2. Discussion for the Next Council Meeting**

The congress unanimously approved to hold 6<sup>th</sup> ASF Council Meeting at the Yongpyong. The council meeting will be organized by Korea Ski Association and ASF Secretariat during the 11<sup>th</sup> Asian Children's Alpine Ski Championships. Detailed information should be announced by ASF Secretariat later.

## **6. Other Business to Be Discussed**

### **6-1. Change of Emblem for ASF**

Mr. Farshid Alizadeh, vice president, I. R. Iran Ski Federation suggested new emblem for ASF in order to activate the activities of Marketing Events for ASF. He showed the prepared new emblem to the members. Lebanese Ski Federation gave a new suggestion. If any member countries who wish to give design of new emblem for ASF, after collecting new ideas within 6 months time, we will select the best idea in the 6<sup>th</sup> ASF Council Meeting.















### **6-2. Abbreviation of Chinese Taipei, "CTA" Issue**

Chinese Ski Association complained about the abbreviation name, CTA of Chinese Taipei which is currently used in FIS, and therefore, in ASF. Chinese Ski Association claimed that abbreviation should be "TPE" instead of "CTA", in line with the new IOC decision and practice of TPE. The president suggested Chinese Taipei to apply officially to FIS for the change to "TPE" from "CTA" at earliest convenience so that FIS can officially change the abbreviation name of Chinese Taipei.





## Report on The Alpine Coaches Seminar on Pole Setting

Reported by Korea Ski Association

Alpine Course Setting Seminar under the auspices of International Ski Federation and Asian Ski Federation was successfully conducted. The general informations and the financial report are reported by Asian Ski Federation as follow.

1. Period: January 31, 1999 – February 7, 1999, coinciding with the 4<sup>th</sup> Asian Winter Games '99 (January 30 - February 6, 1999) at Yongpyong-Kangwon, Korea.
2. Venue: Yongpyong Resort, Korea.
3. FIS Instructor: Mr. Phillippe Chevalier (Swiss Ski Federation)
4. Participants: 20 National Team Coaches from 9 Member Countries (KOR 12, CHN 1, CTA 1, IND 1, IRA 1, JPN 1, KAZ 1, LIB 1, UZB 1)
  - 19 were awarded with FIS Diploma. (due to lack of good attendance, the Indian coach (Mr. Nazir Ahmad Butt) was not awarded.)
5. Comments: All the national team coaches were very impressed with Mr. Chevalier's programs. On-site practice every afternoon after morning competitions for the games, and in-class lecture after everyday alpine captains meeting were also well coordinated with Mr. Maruyama Hotonari, FIS TD for the alpine competition of Asian Winter Games. Actual competition runs for a Men's SL and a Ladies' GS for the games were video-taped and went through an intensive analysis in class lectures. All the coaches worked hard and serious at their studies. Mr. Chevalier was very satisfied with the outcome.

All the coaches really felt very rewarding and became to have more confidence through their new exposure and learning of the expertise knowledge. All felt they should have more of such seminars in future based on some continuous programs. They wanted to have an alpine coaches school in near future. Mr. Chevalier positively responded. Encouragement and enthusiasm were very high, indeed, to both instructor and students with gratifying feelings toward all the arrangements for the alpine seminar this time under the FIS Aid and Promotion Program. Particularly, all the coaches were very happy to receive "Diploma" upon successful and satisfactory completion of the courses, which was jointly signed by the Alpine Committee of FIS and ASF.

It also served a great deal to enhance friendship and solidarity between each ASF member countries, and demonstrated a beautiful coordination and assistance rendered by FIS to ASF under the FIS Aid and Promotion Program.

The total subsidy for the project supported by the FIS Aid and Promotion Program was **SF4,029**, excluding FIS instructor's airfare and remuneration which was directly paid by FIS.



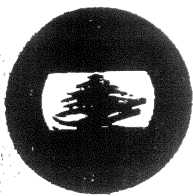

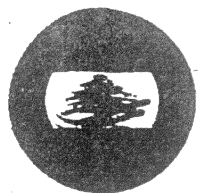

**APPENDIX 6**

# **Constitution**

## **ASIAN SKI FEDERATION**

### **Art 1. (Name)**

The name of the organization is "Asian Ski Federation" and is abbreviated as ASF.

### **Art 2. (Purpose)**

The purpose of the organization is to organize a network of Ski Associations/Federations to exchange information regarding FIS activities and work together for the betterment of ski techniques and the development of all skiing activities, as well as to further the friendship among the Ski Associations/Federations of Asia.

### **Art 3. (Membership)**

Membership will be open to Ski Associations/Federations of Asia subject to the followings on approval by the ASF Congress:

- 3.1 Applicants who are current members of the International Ski Federation (FIS/IVS).
- 3.2 Applicants who are not members of FIS/IVS must meet the following criteria duly certified by their National Olympic Committee (NOC):
  - 3.1.1 Must collectively represent the ski associations of the country.
  - 3.1.2 Must be recognized as the sole representative of the sport by the respective National Olympic Committee.
  - 3.1.3 Must conduct competitions at the national level with participation from its member associations.
  - 3.1.4 Must provide a copy of its organization along with the names of its member associations.
- 3.3 Affiliate membership may be granted to nations whose applications are being processed for approval on those that are in the development stage and have yet to meet the basic criteria.
  - 3.3.1 Affiliate members may be invited to attend the ASF Congress as observers, but do not have the voting right.



**Art 4. (Withdrawal)**

A member Association/Federation will be automatically excluded if it applies for withdrawal of membership in writing.

**Art 5. (Officials)****(1) Delegates;**

Each Ski Association/Federation shall be represented by two delegates at the annual conference, hereafter called the Congress. The Congress is the legislative organ of this organization.

**(2) Council Members;**

The Council is elected by the vote of the delegates at the Congress. A Council member cannot be a member of the Council and a delegate to Congress at the same time. If a Association/Federation Delegate is elected to a Council Member, that Ski Association/Federation must send another member as a Delegate.

**Art 6. (Council)**

Council is the executive organ of the organization and consists of the following members.

**(1) President**

The President represents and commends whole activities of this organization. President chairs the Congress and Council and has a decisive vote when pro and con are even.

**(2) Vice President**

Up to 3 Vice Presidents support President and in case the president is absent or unable to carry out his duties, one of the Vice President will take over the duties of the President. Vice President may not belong to same Association/Federation as President.

**(3) Member**

Up to 8 members representing different Association/Federation will be elected as Director.

**(4) Secretary General**

Secretary General is appointed by President and responsible for the managerial works related to the activities organized.



**(5) Non-standing member**

Non-standing member may present at the Council and Congress but with no voting right

**(a) Honorary Member;**

Honorary member group may express their opinions to Presidents.

**(b) Auditor;**

Two auditors are in charge of auditing the financial reports and activities and reporting at the Council and Congress

**Art 7. (Terms Office)**

The Terms for officials are two years. Each official and the Council Member are re-eligible at will.

**Art 8. (Conference)**

- (1) The Congress and the council will be held every spring; provided, however, in years when either the Asian Winter Games or the FIS International Congress is held, the Congress will be held at the same time and the site. The time and place of the Congress will be determined one year in advance. The President shall notify the Members of the Council and Delegates of the Congress of the time and place of the meetings.
- (2) If a Member cannot attend, his/her ski Association/Federation may appoint another person to attend instead. The topics of discussion at the meeting of the Council shall be submitted to the Council from the Congress. The Council meets, at the invitation of the President, as often as the business requires.

**Art 9. (Expenditures and Fees)**

The expenditures of this organization shall be covered by membership fees plus contributions. The annual membership fee is \$ U.S. 200 to be paid at the time of the annual Congress. This fee covers office expenses and other minor expenses. The delegate of their respective ski Associations/Federations will be responsible for all expenses related to attending the annual Congress.



**Art 10. (Amendment)**

This Constitution will become effective upon approval at the Congress and amendments can be made only at the Congress.

**Art 11. (Secretariat)**

- (1) The Secretariat will be located within the office of the Ski Associations/ Federations of the President and a few liaison offices will be established when necessary.
- (2) The official language is English.

**Art 12. (Others)**

Any matters which are not covered by this constitution shall be prevailed by FIS Statutes, Regulations and decisions from the Council and Congress.
