1. Roll-Call for the Participants & Congress

 - Opening of the congress was announced.

2. Greetings by Chairman (Dr. Sung-Won Lee, President, ASF)

Dr. Sung-Won Lee - president, Asian Ski Federation – welcomes the participants.

The 45th FIS congress of 2006 and the 9th Asian Ski Federation Congress is being staged in the beautiful coast of Portugal this time in Vilamoura-Algarve. I sincerely welcome all the delegates of Asian Ski Federation to the congress. I am very much delighted to see the attendance of the two delegates of DPRK this time after a long absence to the congress. I specially welcome them to the congress. I also like to note the special attendance of 3 delegates from Kyrgyzstan today. They have expressed their application for a member of ASF and are permitted to sit in the congress meeting as observers. Official application process will be processed in due time. I do welcome their participation today.

ASF had a successful the 14th Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Children) at Beidahu, Jilin, China in February 2005 with good support of Chinese Ski association. The Beidahu is the ski resort where the ski event of the 6th Changchun Asian winter Games is going to take place in February next year. We also had a successful 2006 Asian Alpine Ski Championships (Junior) at Yomase ski resort of Nagano under a special support of Nagano Ski Association, Shigakogen Ski Club and The Ski Association of Japan in March 2006. I am very appreciative of the two host countries and the related organizing committees. Both events were supported by FIS Aid and Promotion Program financially as before; coverage of round trip airfares (country to country) for 4 racers and 1 coach for each participating member country, for which ASF is very much thankful. The details would be reported later again under the report items.

I thank you, once again, for your attendance to this congress and wish each National Ski Association for the continued success and prosperity, expecting to see your attentive support and initiative to the future development of ASF. I wish you all to have a pleasant and fruitful stay here at the beautiful coast of Vilamoura.

3. Special Guest Speech (Mr. Gian-Franco Kasper, President, FIS)

I am very happy to attend at the 9th ASF Congress Meeting today and to greet all of you as member of ASF country. ASF has been conducting his important role in the stage of International Ski development.

I have been reported 2006 FIS Junior Snowboard Championships in Korea and ASF Children Championships in China and Japan organized successfully.

The 2006 Winter Olympic Games in Torino and the successful winter of 2005/2006 have now passed into history, and the International Ski Federation can again turn more of its attention of future tasks, including the World Championships in all FIS disciplines in coming winter of 2006/2007 especially with the Nordic World Championships at Sapporo in Japan.

The WADA has convened a meeting to address blood testing, notably the use and interpretation of blood parameters. As one of the leading International Federations involved in blood testing, FIS Anti-Doping Expert have been invited to participate and share their experience and views with other experts.

We will endeavor to promote skiing, to increase the number of skiers worldwide and to intensify cooperation between FIS and ASF. Once again, I would like to express my appreciation to your kind cooperation and ASF's effort for global skiing development.

4. Acceptance of Official Minutes of the 8th ASF Congress in Miami

There were no other views for the minutes of the 8th ASF congress which was held at Miami, USA in June 2004. The minutes had been circulated to member countries for review and any comments on July 16th, 2004.

5-2 Report on the 14th Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships at Beidahu ski resort in Jilin, China in February 2005
(Reported by China)

The 14th Asian Children Alpine Ski Championships was held on February 26th to 27th of 2004 at the Beidahu ski resort in Jilin, China, where the 2007 Asian Winter Games will take place. This was the second time for China to stage the championships. Hong Kong participated first time. The FIS Aid and Promotion Program supported the round trip airfare for 4 racers and 1 coach. ASF president's report to FIS is attached.

The 15th Asian Junior Alpine Ski Championships was held on March 16th to 17th of 2006 at the Yomase ski resort in Nagano, Japan. The participation of a total women's team from Mongolia was notable. The championships was successful with the special support of the Ski Association of Nagano and the Shigakogen Ski Club. I am sure that this championships contributed greatly to enhance the friendship and the solidarity between each member countries. The FIS Aid and Promotion Program supported the round trip airfare for 4 racers and 1 coach. ASF president's report to FIS is attached.

6. Discussions

6-1 Agenda Proposals

6-1-1 China

The proposal for Asian Cross-Country Ski Championships by Chinese Ski Association was in principle welcomed by the delegates of Winter Games Federation of India. However president expressed his view that this agenda cannot be studied and settled in a short discussion in this meeting, president suggested to have a detailed follow-up discussions among president and vice presidents after this meeting.

After a series of follow-up meetings between ASF vice president Wang of China, ASF vice president Maruyama of Japan, ASF vice president Shemshaki of Iran, and ASF president Dr. Lee have come to the following conclusion.

- 1) The title "Asian Cross-Country Championships" cannot be used unless the championships is staged among member countries in a sequence of turn continuously every year with over all participation of member countries.
- 2) It is desirable to hold such a championships under ASF, however it is not be yet matured time enough to conceive such a championships.
- 3) First, CHN should start to have a domestic cross-country championships as a FIS race with a domestic suitable name such as Chinese, Changchun, Beijing Cross-Country Championships.
- 4) For the FIS race, a domestic cross-country championships, CHN can invite foreign competitors, from near region nations or even European with complete undertaking of domestic expenses of participation. Furthermore, CHN can consider some support of airfare subsidy from their countries to China, partially or full, for initial stage promotion of the championships.
- 5) Upon confirming successful execution of such a championships over 3-5 years, CHN can discuss close regional countries and other ASF member countries for alternating staging of such a championships between the regional countries.
- 6) Once other countries are become prepared to undertake a FIS cross-country competition regularly, then such cross-country competitions can be elevated to "Asia Cross-Country Championships."
- 7) When such a coordinated cross-country championships is foreseen, among member countries a financial support by FIS is to be carefully studied to give any support for air-travel expenses of foreign participants to the championships, which is similar to the case of the ASF alpine championships.

6-1-2 Lebanon

6-1-3 Tajikistan

In view of difficulties involved in realistic means of assistance to Tajikistan in ski equipments and ski slope facilities, this matter should be dealt independently with the Ski Federation of Tajikistan by president. A fax letter from TJK is attached.

6-1-4 Pakistan

The proposal agenda, establishment of "South Asia Cup" alpine competition between Pakistan, Iran and India, by Ski Federation of Pakistan was discussed preliminarily between Mr. Paracha, vice president of the Ski Federation of Pakistan and president of Asian Ski Federation covering from basic elements involved with development of alpine ski in Pakistan and its current status.

An intent e-mail by PAK for the idea of the "South Asia Cup" had been addressed officially to FIS and FIS immediately raised their concern about possible conflict with FIS Continental Cup competitions such as current "Far East Cup". FIS notified their concern to ASF and asked to settle this issue in ASF amicably. The involved problems were well explained and clarified to PAK, and after series of follow-up discussions also with Mr. Shemshaki, vice president of ASF from IRA. The followings are concluded

- 1) Use of the name "South Asia Cup" is not acceptable because (1) it seems to connote division of "Asian" (2) It conflicts with FIS Continental Cup, i.e., Far East Cup, which may create confusion with FIS. This point has already been pointed out by FIS.

- 2) Pakistan will emphasize first in establishing a well managed FIS alpine competition domestically and promote exchange of alpine competitors with neighboring FIS alpine competitions in Iran and India. Participation of PAK athletes in Iran's FIS alpine competitions is highly recommended for development of PAK alpine ski for both skiing technique and competition management.
- 3) PAK and IND should promote annual domestic FIS alpine competitions respectively, and engage in exchanging alpine racers and competition know-how with neighboring Iranian FIS alpine competitions.
- 4) Once such exchange of alpine competitions among IRA, PAK and IND becomes well established and routine, then we can talk about alternating hosting of regional FIS alpine competition under appropriate domestic competition name. It might take at least 3 - 4 years to reach such a stage. Stepwise development is important and essential.

- The vice presidents, Shoji Maruyama of Japan, Yitao Wang of China, and Issa Saveh Shemshaki of Iran were re-elected as vice presidents unanimously.
- New directors from KAZ, LIB and PAK will be nominated later through follow-up correspondence, while other directors remain same.
- Auditors, Vladimir Lisov of UZB and Chin-Ying Chen of TPE were re-elected as auditors unanimously.

8. Any Other Business

8-1 About Ski Disciplines for 2007 Asian Winter Games

The ski disciplines decided between OCA and host nation, China for the 2007 Changchun Asia Winter Games, were discussed. Japan and Korea raised the point that some of the most popular and basic disciplines are not included in the ski disciplines in the AWG programs such as Parallel GS and SB cross competitions in Snow Board, Mogul competition in Free Style, and Super Giant Slalom in Alpine. Parallel GS in Snow Board is very basic program in SB competition and the easiest in preparation.




















Super GS of Alpine had been understood to be included and the Super GS slope was under construction plan at Beidahu ski resort in March 2006. However, the Chinese Ski Association re-iterated that it is not possible to include any new disciplines in addition to the current schedule.







5. Comments

The championships at Beidahu of Jilin this time has lead to an important new finding of a good ski resort in China. Compared to well known Yabuli near Harbin of Heiryungjian province further upper north, the Beidahu is possessing more moderate natural environments.

Temperature is milder (about -18°C ~ -20°C at night, -8°C ~ -10°C day time). Mountains are smoother. The resort is well surrounded by chains of mountains almost all around except inlet. We can have DH of at least 900 m height differential though it might not meet a top challenging course. Now, Men and Women SG courses are under development for the 2007 Asian winter Games. You can glance all the alpine courses from the center of the resort even though all the finish areas are not joining together. Jump ski and cross-country ski sites are also inside of the Beidahu valley, which needs extensive renovations.

I am confident that the Beidahu can become one of leading ski resorts in East Asia once they are successfully through with the 2007 Asian Winter Games. I am strongly pushing the Beidahu to stage some FIS Far East Continental Cups races in near future hopefully as fast as 2008. Invitation of foreign countries (Korea, Japan and some European racers) is key issue for China.

It is noteworthy that Chinese children won 5 gold medals out of 8. First time for Chinese winning so many gold medals in Asian Alpine Ski Championships.

5. Comments

The Asian Alpine Championships has a special link with Japan, because the 1st Asian Children Alpine Ski Championship Games was held at Suzuran Kogen of Gifu, Japan, next door to Nagano in March 1991, some 15 years ago. This is the 5th time Asian Ski Championships conducted in Japan over 15 years of history of Asian Ski Championships.

The Yomase ski resort in Nagano, Japan is at the entrance of Shigakogen where the FIS World Cups took place. During the championships, temperature was fairly mild (about -4°C ~ -1°C at night, 3°C ~ 8°C day time). Although the SL race was postponed a little because of bad weather condition, the championships was very successful.

A notable feature, this time, was that the award was given to the 1st to 6th place of racers and to the best racer of each nation. From the 1st to 3rd racers were awarded the medals (gold, silver, bronze). From the 4th to 6th place of racers and the best racer of each country in each category were awarded with the diplomas.

It was very rewarding to observe that Iranian athletes obtaining one silver and two bronze medals in straight competitions. Two Iranian boys who started to compete from the time of Children I and II at Asian Children Alpine Championships, now, have reached Junior level and have achieved medals, bronze and silver, with their leveling up in skiing technique. It is really a wonderful feeling to note that their FIS points are now reaching around 50 in SL and around 80 in GS. I feel that the Iranian Ski Federation is also doing a good job in raising their ski racers.

It was a total surprise to see participation of a total women's team (3 racers and 1 coach) from Mongolia this time. This is first time ever to see a women's team from the country. This can be regarded as another form of development in Asian alpine ski.

Owing to the Organizing Committee's hard works, dedication to the commitment, and the good supervision of the Ski Association of Japan over the important event, the championships was successfully carried out. It was, also, a great exposure for all the foreign participants to the big snow, hot spring, and beautiful winter scenery of Nagano, enjoying friendship and solidarity among Asian ski families.

The Asian Ski Federation is very appreciative of the special hospitalities extended by the people of the Yomase Ski Resort, the Ski Association of Nagano, the Shigakogen Ski Club and, in particular, the effective control by the Ski Association of Japan for the success of the important championships.
